Keeping our Children Safe

I wrote to all parents at the start of this term asking for your cooperation in keeping our pupils safe, particularly at the start and end of the school day. The key ways in which you can support us with this is by;-

- Avoiding parking in the school car park (except by prior arrangement) at any time, including when collecting or dropping off from before or after school activities.
- Using the school crossing point at the top of the car park and avoid crossing the car park or at the school gates.
- Leaving the school grounds promptly at the end of the day and discouraging pupils from playing on the playground, play equipment or in the garden area at the top gate.

These arrangements help us to ensure all pupils have been collected and avoid unnecessary accidents from occurring. Thank you for your help in enforcing these requests.
