many of the disciplines and as a result were the overall winners. We are now waiting to find out if they have been successful in representing Wirral schools at the Merseyside Youth games later in the year.




## **Eco Team brighten up KS1 entrance**

# **School Improvements**

Another busy summer has seen an new boiler system installed, which will provide hot water and heating across the school. classrooms. The landings and two staircases have been carpeted, covering the tiled floor, and this has seen a reduction of noise in this area. This is part of our on-going commitment to improve the school environment.
