Dear Parents / Carers,

I cannot believe we are already at the end of our first half-term - the seven weeks at St. Peter's have certainly flown by. The children and staff have been extremely busy with their learning activities both inside and outside of the classroom. After the break, I know our Key Stage 2 children are excited to be going on their class visits to the Liverpool Museum and the Weaver Hall Museum. There is also a planned visit from the 'Hedgehog Lady' for our Early Years children to look forward to!

Communication

Regular communication between home and school is one of the most positive ways in which children can be supported through their school years, and we seek to encourage this dialogue wherever possible. We very much value your support and interest in your child's education. Parents and carers will continue to receive a variety of letters and daily email messages to keep you informed about events in school. We also have our school website and social media feed showing the latest information about school events. All parents and carers are welcome to attend school social and community events and invitations to these events will come via newsletter, daily email, social media messages or correspondence from Friends of St. Peter's. Parents can contact their child's class teacher via Seesaw. Ideally, we would ask parents when using Seesaw to message staff no later than 5.00pm. If this is not possible, then any messages sent after 5.00pm via Seesaw will not be actioned by the class teacher until the next working day. Teachers will use Seesaw to communicate class or pupil specific messages with regard to school work or class-based events. Parents are invited to use Seesaw to keep us informed of any special events or achievements, however small, which happen outside school. This enables us to share in your child's interests and to assess progress in a broader context. All pupil absences / appointments should be directed to the school office.

Those parents who wish to offer any kind of help during the school day are very welcome to contact the school office in the first instance. It should be stressed that such help does not allow a parent to have contact with their own child, as this would seem both unfair to other pupils and possibly distract the individual child from the necessary level of interaction with the class teacher.

Maths Update

We have been running our updated maths mastery programme for a number of weeks now, and we have been really pleased with how the roll-out is going. Our children have been able to engage in deeper-level thinking, as well as ensuring that our children are challenged and

supported, regardless of their maths ability. However, don't just take our word for it – have a look at some of the responses from the children across the school.

"It's been really good. I found the Maths No Problem textbooks a bit boring sometimes but now lessons seem to go really quickly. We do our Fluent in Five and then we practice our skills and then we have to do some challenges. There's always a problem to do and you get to work with your friends to try and solve it." – Year 5/6 pupil.

"I like maths. Our lessons are really good. I like using the equipment and we can see how to do it on the board. You can pick your own challenge to try and push yourself. Usually 'Tiny' has got an answer wrong and you have to explain why." – Year 3/4 pupil.

"I like doing the sums like adding and if you do good work 'Tiny' sits on the table. I like using the squares in my maths book." – Year 1/2 pupil.

Keeping Safe

As we move closer to the winter months, the mornings and late afternoons will be darker and so it is a good opportunity for us to remind children about road safety when walking both to and from school.

Please can I ask for your help with this by: -

- Avoiding parking in the school car park except by prior arrangement
- Using the pedestrian crossing point at the top of the school car park and avoid crossing directly through the car park
- Leaving the school grounds promptly at the end of the day
- Avoid parking on the zig-zag lines outside the main school entrance

Hopefully, following these simple steps will help avoid any unnecessary accidents to children and adults.

Reminder – Parking Around School

I would once again like to take this opportunity to remind parents of the importance of parking safely and with care. Please avoid parking on zig-zag lines, the single and double yellow lines and on kerbs. Also, when parking around school at the beginning and the end of the day, can we please be mindful of our neighbours. Our careful parking will help to keep all of our children and families safe.

School Data – Year 6 Attainment 2022

I am pleased to be able to share our extremely positive Key Stage 2 data for the academic year 2021-2022. As you can see from the data contained within the table, last year's Year 6 cohort performed exceptionally well in their Standard Assessment Tests (SATs). In all areas assessed, the Year 6 cohort data was above both local and national figures. As a school we are really proud of this as it means we have outperformed many schools within our local area and nationally. Well done to last year's Year 6 cohort for a good set of data results.

School Improvement Priorities 2022-2023

As a school, we identify key priorities to ensure we continually improve outcomes for children and the school. Throughout this year, we have two very experienced Education Consultants working alongside our staff, providing support to ensure identified key priorities are addressed.

This year, three of our school priorities include:

- To successfully implement a new Mathematical Scheme of Work (White Rose) to support the children to further improve their mathematical attainment.
- To successfully implement a new Writing Scheme of Work (Read to Write) to support the children to further improve their writing attainment.
- To successfully implement a Phonics Scheme of Work (Little Wandle) to support the children to further improve their phonic knowledge and attainment.

Thank you to those families who supported the Harvest Festival be donating food. It was wonderful to see so many items arriving which shows how supportive our school community is. I am sure many families will be extremely grateful for all your donations.

Online Safety

I would like to draw to your attention the internet safety information on the school's website. This can be found under the 'Remote Learning – Online Safety' tab and contains guidance that is designed to help parents and carers keep their children as safe as possible when online. Our best piece of advice is to be curious about what your children are doing when online, take an interest in their activities and regularly check what they are doing.

Pupil Attendance

As we are at the end of the first half-term, we are able to analyse our attendance rates more clearly. As a school, we set a target for our children to have an attendance rate of at least 97%. Good attendance is a vital element in helping children to achieve their educational outcomes. Therefore, we politely ask families to plan their holidays around school breaks and avoid asking permission to take their children out of school during term time. Also, if possible, we ask that medical appointments for children are made after school hours or late in the day.
