School Improvement Priorities 2024-2025

I am pleased to share our school development priorities with you for this forthcoming school year. Basically, this is what we are aiming to improve over the course of the year. These have been put together by senior leaders in school based on last year's work and results and have been agreed with the Governing Body.

- To continue to develop a culture of reading for pleasure across the school.
- Build on the curriculum work previously done to identify the key knowledge and subject specific concepts in foundation subjects that should be taught and revisited over time. (follow up to the OFSTED report last year)
- To improve the quality of writing across the school focus on greater depth writing.
- To maximise the mental health and well-being of all staff and pupils.
- To develop the children's understanding of diversity, including experiences of other faiths and world religions with particular focus on the protected characteristics of the Equality Act 2010. (SIAMS)

Hopefully as the year progresses you will be able to see how some of the work is going as it should be evident in the children's books and how they are speaking, Particularly the work on diversity which will cover lots of different areas. In fact this has alr4ady started with the Year 1/2 classes covering lots of diversity work this week.

Parents Evening

Thank you to all the parents who attended the parents evening meeting this week. I hope you found it useful. I would also like to thank the teachers who stayed late on 2 nights and also spent considerable time preparing notes in advance. Our next parents evening will be in the Spring term but if you have any



concerns in between please do get in contact with school and speak to your child's class teacher.

Roofing Works

Starting on Friday 25 October we will have some work starting to reroof part of the school, namely the Y1/2CW and Y1/2F classrooms (these are the ones that face out onto the playground). The most intrusive work will take place over the half term break but there will be areas of the playground fenced off for the contractors to use when we return to school after half term. The entire job is expected to take 3 weeks in total so there shouldn't be too much disruption. It was important that we got this work done sooner rather than later and definitely before the winter weather moves in.
