KS2 Sports Afternoon

FS2/KS1 Sports Afternoon

The children in Foundation 2 and Years 1/2 will be taking part in a carousel of sport and games activities on Thursday 9th July, weather permitting. The afternoon will begin at 1.15pm with some Pre-school Races before our children commence their activities and challenges moving around with their designated group. Parents and family members are welcome to watch and encourage their child during the afternoon by walking around the outside of the field with their child's group as they move to the different activity stations. Transition Morning & New Classes

On Wednesday 8th July, the children will be spending the morning with their new classes and, for those moving into a new year-band, their new class teacher. A great deal of time and consideration is afforded by the teachers when determining the groupings for next year. The transition morning has proved to be hugely beneficial to our children, particularly those moving to a new class as they come to spend the morning with their new teacher, which helps to prevent the anxiety and stress that can sometimes occur for a very small minority of children.

Building Project – New Extension

I am delighted to be able to confirm that our school has secured funding for phase two of the extension project at the front of school. This will see a new staffroom being built on the balcony area at the front of school. In addition to this, a new staircase will be built that will provide pupil only access through the KS2 doors at the front of school. The staircase will run adjacent to the two front classrooms and provide access from the playground.

The new staffroom will enable the existing staffroom to be converted into a multi-use learning hub in the centre of school. It will provide a flexible space, creating two smaller areas for group and intervention work, as well as one large space that can be used as a small classroom. It will also provide a much needed room for meetings with professionals, staff and parents. It is anticipated that the work will begin in January 2016; further information relating to this will be published in the autumn.

Leavers Service

The annual Leavers' Service for our Year 6 pupils will take place at St. Peter's Church on Monday 13th July at 7pm. The service will be led by myself and the Year 5/6 Teachers, including a special song from Concordia and the pupils in Year 5. All are welcome to attend to support our Year 6 as they prepare to leave St. Peter's and move on to their secondary schools.
