Communication

Regular communication between home and school is one of the most positive ways in which children can be supported through their school years, and we seek to encourage this dialogue wherever possible. We very much value your support and interest in your child's education. Parents and carers will continue to receive a variety of letters and daily email messages to keep you informed about events in school. We also have our school website and social media feed showing the latest information about school events. All parents and carers are welcome to attend school social and community events and invitations to these events will come via newsletter, daily email, social media messages or correspondence from Friends of St. Peter's. Parents can contact their child's class teacher via Seesaw. Ideally, we would ask parents when using Seesaw to message staff no later than 5.00pm. If this is not possible, then any messages sent after 5.00pm via Seesaw will not be actioned by the class teacher until the next working day. Teachers will use Seesaw to communicate class or pupil specific messages with regard to school work or class-based events. Parents are invited to use Seesaw to keep us informed of any special events or achievements, however small, which happen outside school. This enables us to share in your child's interests and to assess progress in a broader context. All pupil absences / appointments should be directed to the school office. Those parents who wish to offer any kind of help during the school day are very welcome to contact the school office in the first instance. It should be stressed that such help does not allow a parent to have contact with their own child, as this would seem both unfair to other pupils and possibly distract the individual child from the necessary level of interaction with the class teacher.

Early Years F1 and F2


Early Years are always having fun with their learning. They have been constructing toys and junk modelling! They have also been looking at our PETERS value of Effort, which has been our value this half term.

have had opportunity to write in a range of styles, genres and purposes, culminating in some absolutely fantastic written work!







Courageous Advocacy


Fundraising and community events

Keeping Safe

As we are in the midst of the winter months, the mornings and late afternoons will be darker and so it is a good opportunity for us to remind children about road safety when walking both to and from school.

Please can I ask for your help with this by: -

- Avoiding parking in the school car park except by prior arrangement
- Using the pedestrian crossing point at the top of the school car park and avoid crossing directly through the car park
- Leaving the school grounds promptly at the end of the day
- Avoid parking on the zig-zag lines outside the main school entrance

Hopefully, following these simple steps will help avoid any unnecessary accidents to children and adults.

<u>Reminder – Parking Around School</u>

I would once again like to take this opportunity to remind parents of the importance of parking safely and with care. Please avoid parking on zig-zag lines, the single and double yellow lines and on kerbs. Also, when parking around school at the beginning and the end of the day, can we please be mindful of our neighbours. Our careful parking will help to keep all of our children and families safe.

Online Safety

I would like to draw to your attention the internet safety information on the school's website. This can be found under the 'Remote Learning – Online Safety' tab and contains guidance that is designed to help parents and carers keep their children as safe as possible when online. Our best piece of advice is to be curious about what your children are doing when online, take an interest in their activities and regularly check what they are doing.

Pupil Attendance

As we are at the end of the first term, we are able to analyse our attendance rates more clearly. As a school, we set a target for our children to have an attendance rate of at least 97%. Good attendance is a vital element in helping children to achieve their educational outcomes. Therefore, we politely ask families to plan their holidays around school breaks and avoid asking permission to take their children out of school during term time. Also, if possible, we ask that medical appointments for children are made after school hours or late in the day.
